Vale Lesley (Yvonne) Falloon, OAM



Lesley passed away at Fairway on 17 August 2023. Laurence Evans, a Board Member, Jennifer Taylor, our CEO, a number of residents, and myself as Chairperson, attended the Funeral and Thanksgiving Service for the life of Lesley at Holy Trinity Anglican Church in Hampton on Monday 28 August 2023.

Lesley's daughter Janet gave a beautiful eulogy to Lesley which outlined so many of the achievements in Lesley's life. And there were so many. Lesley's life was one of enormous community service and involvement in local organisations, which included serving as a Councillor at the former City of Sandringham from 1978 to 1992, and being the Mayor of the City of Sandringham in 1982/83 and in 1991/1992.

Lesley was the recipient of an Order of Australia award in 1995 for her enormous community service.

But it is Lesley's involvement in Fairway Hostel, the prior name of Fairway Bayside Aged Care, that I want to acknowledge in this tribute.

Lesley was instrumental in the establishment of Fairway Hostel. She, with a number of other founding members, had the vision to establish a facility to better cater for the needs of the elderly in the then City of Sandringham. It is one thing to have a vision, but it is another thing to turn that vision into reality, and the enormous amount of time and work that it takes.

When I proposed to the Fairway Board in May 2020 that consideration should be given to a further expansion of Fairway, and to carry out works to rectify a number of current operational issues with the existing layout, I had to review a significant amount of the documentation relating to the establishment of the 30 bed Fairway Hostel, which opened on 30 April 1996.

And Lesley's name was everywhere. Whether it was in liaising with governments of all levels regarding funding for the facility, or fundraising with community organisations, or dealing with then City of Sandringham or the then Sandringham Hospital regarding the development of the facility, Lesley was heavily involved.

Lesley and others were also involved in the establishment of the incorporated association known as Sandringham Aged Care Association Inc (SACA) which drove the development of Fairway Hostel, which was the legal entity that operated Fairway Hostel when it opened in April 1996.

Lesley was the inaugural president of SACA as well as a generous financial founder, and was a Committee person for many years. She remained a member of the governing body of Fairway until her death, and retained an active interest in Fairway, and I am told attended

every annual general meeting until her health allowed otherwise.

It was only fitting that Lesley became a resident at Fairway in June last year for the last part of her life.

The Fairway community and the wider Bayside community, and all the residents and families who have enjoyed the benefits of Fairway, owe an enormous debt of gratitude for all the work that Lesley did for Fairway.

There are many persons in life who will tell you why things cannot be done as they are too hard. And there are those who tell you it can be done, even though there are significant hurdles and obstacles to overcome, and who get on and make dreams a reality.

Lesley was one of the latter, and how fortunate Fairway is for everything she did.

Vale Lesley, and on behalf of everyone associated with Fairway our sincere condolences to Janet and Lesley's family.






Students

Austin was consistently in the top ten percent of his classes which meant he could transition to the Senior Cambridge School, which is akin to a selective finishing school, with ease.


Austin enjoyed a variety of sports from boxing to kickboxing, kung fu, and hockey.
